

GIFT EVALUATION

This evaluation is designed to assist you in identifying your strengths as specifically relating to ministry and service in the local church. Its primary purpose is to enable you to pinpoint areas of ministry for which you are most likely gifted. It is not designed to be an exhaustive analysis of spiritual gifts, but rather to highlight areas of strength based on what you feel motivates you spiritually.

Keep in mind when you score yourself that most of these are desirable traits for a Christian to have and giving yourself a 0 or 1 on a particular trait does not mean that you are unspiritual, but rather that it is not a primary motivating factor for you as an individual.

Also, keep in mind that the church will not be looking at your individual answers to particular questions, but rather using the overall information to highlight areas in which you are especially gifted and motivated. Once your primary areas of ministry strength are identified, we can then use this information to identify specific service opportunities which may be of interest to you.

What follows is a summary of each of the gifts. Along with giving you insight into your own motivations, these should be helpful in directing you towards areas of service which will utilize the strengths that God has given you.

ADMINISTRATION

Is a goal and objective-oriented person. Strong organizational skills Able to coordinate resources in order to accomplish tasks as quickly as possible.

EVANGELISM

Has an especially strong desire to share the Gospel with non-believers in every possible situation and through all possible means. His greatest joy in ministry is seeing non-believers won to Christ. He would rather devote his effort to the ministry of evangelism instead of more edificational ministries.

EXHORTATION

Has a special ability to encourage others in the body of Christ by giving them needed words of comfort, courage and counsel at times of need or crisis. He is especially attracted to individuals who are genuinely seeking spiritual growth. Has the ability to accurately assess spiritual needs, explain truth logically, and give step-by-step instructions which are easy to follow.

GIVING

Has the ability to give material goods and financial resources with joy, so that the needs of the Lord's work are met. Often can discern wise investments, usually an effective money manager. Not desiring of public recognition. Enjoys knowing that needs are met and prayer answered. Can see financial needs others overlook.

HELPS

Motivated by a desire to further the ministry by meeting genuine needs of another individual, usually someone in a leadership position. Enjoys bringing immediate help to key individuals in order to relieve their burdens and responsibilities.

HOSPITALITY

Has the ability to make guests feel comfortable and "at home." He has a desire to provide a warm welcome to guests whether in a ministry or social setting. Often delights in opening his home to individuals or groups.

LEADERSHIP

Has the ability to lead others toward spiritual growth. Often considered visionary, and has the ability to set goals and motivate others toward the accomplishment of these goals. More concerned with the "Big Picture" than the person with the gift of Administration.

MERCY

Has immediate compassion for those suffering, physically, mentally, or emotionally. He derives great joy in meeting the needs of others, and often has a tendency to attract people who are in distress. Usually has a need for friendships in which there is deep communication and mutual commitment, and has the ability to draw out the feelings of others while also being vulnerable to hurts, both personal and to those which others are experiencing. Would rather remove the causes of hurts than to look for benefits from them. Has a tendency to avoid confrontation and closes his spirit to others who they feel are overly harsh.

SERVICE

Has the ability to perform any task with joy which benefits others and meets practical needs. May disregard personal health and comfort to serve others. Has difficulty saying "No". Attention for details and like clear instructions. Faces the Danger of getting over involved and feeling unappreciated for his behind the scenes work.

SHEPHERDING

Has the unique ability to take responsibility for the long-term spiritual growth of a group of believers. Sees it as his responsibility to guide, feed, and protect a flock of followers in Christ. He is motivated by a desire to see those under him enjoying spiritual health and growth.

TEACHING

Has the ability to explain God's truth so there is understanding and application in the lives of others. Has a desire to research and present truth in an organized and systematic sequence. Often alert to details, and places great emphasis on accuracy. Motivated by the desire to learn and share knowledge with others.
