SOCIAL MEDIA CHALLENGES

The First Priority Social Media Challenge is designed to assist students in engaging their peers with the gospel.

Each week of the school year will offer a challenge to students to post to their social media accounts (Instagram, Twitter, Tik Tok, Facebook, etc.) memes, texts, or videos that communicate the theme of each HOPE Cycle and communicate the Gospel.

First Priority will provide memes for each of the weeks, but students can create their own materials for posting, if desired.

Each week of the **HOPE** Cycle has a different focus: Speak, Offer, Answer, and Proclaim (SOAP)

- ₩ Week: Speak the Truth Post based on the cycle's theme.
- Week: Offer a Question Ask a question to spark discussion.
- **P** Week: Answer the Question Share your answer to last week's question.
- **E** Week: Proclaim the Gospel Proclaim the Good News of Hope in Christ.

Adult Support Roles

Club Coaches

Coaches are adults who volunteer to train and equip students to lead their First Priority Clubs.

Coaches help students:

- Plan and prepare each week's club.
- Navigate crisis and conflict.
- Manage their club time well.
- Provide students with First Priority resources.

Coaches commit to:

- Register as a volunteer with the school.
- Be trained and vetted by First Priority.
- Fill out club reports.
- Utilize First Priority resources.
- Attend club meetings as allowed by the school.
- Attend First Priority Network meetings.

Teacher Sponsors

Sponsors are teachers who volunteer to open their rooms for First Priority Club meetings and provide access to school resources.

Teacher sponsors:

- Liaison between the school and the club.
- Attend club meetings.
- Help access things, such as getting club on announcements, access to class boards, and other resources.

Parents

Parents support students in prayer and celebrate them.

Parents:

- Volunteer to help at the club.
- Provide food and snacks for the club meeting.
- Get their church on board with praying for and supporting First Priority.
- Promote First Priority to other parents and the community.

Business Leaders

The business community provides financial support and organizational leadership, so that First Priority is in every school in your area for many years to come.

Business leaders:

- Provide financial support.
- Serve as board members or advisors to the local First Priority chapter.
- Promote First Priority to other business and community leaders.

Churches

Churches support the ministry of First Priority in the school.

Churches:

- Send students to be missionaries to their schools.
- Pray for the student missionaries, their schools, and for students to come to faith.
- Give financially to support the ministry of First Priority.
- Receive new students into their churches for long-term community and disciple-making.



EXPLAIN

Who you are today determines who you will be tomorrow. If you want to be a better student, you have to decide today to study and put in the work. If you want to grow in your relationship with God, you have to decide today to spend time reading His Word, the Bible. So when we decide what we want to do with our lives, we have more control than we think.

In Joshua chapter 24 verse 14, Joshua gave Israel a challenge: "Now therefore fear the LORD and serve him in sincerity and in faithfulness. Put away the gods that your fathers served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD." The decision was in their hands. God did not force Himself on anyone, but Joshua had already decided that he would follow and serve the Lord. In verse 15, Joshua gave them the choice: to serve the gods of their fathers or serve the Lord. You see, we do not need to convince people to serve the Lord. We have nothing to fear and everything to gain by presenting the options and giving our friends and family the right to make up their own minds.

Then Joshua made it personal at the end of verse 15: "But as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD." At the end of the day, it comes down to this: YOU must choose to serve the Lord. It won't happen by accident. You must begin each day by choosing to serve Him and then follow up that decision with a bunch of small choices in the right direction. If you follow Jesus, there will come a time when you must say, "Do what you want, and whatever you do, I will still be your friend, but I am going to serve the Lord."

The request is clear: Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve. I pray you will make the right choice. As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.








"The young man said to him, 'All these I have kept. What do I still lack?' Jesus said to him, 'If you would be perfect, go, sell what you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me.'" Matthew 19:20-21

EXPLAIN

We don't usually think of ourselves as being rich. There are people with bigger houses, more money, and nicer stuff. There is a sense of security when we have everything we need. Instead of looking to God to find our worth, we look at our "stuff" for that.

In the Book of Matthew chapter 19, we read about a young guy who was very wealthy. We call him the rich young ruler. He asked Jesus what good deed he must do to have eternal life. Jesus told him to follow the commandments. The rich young ruler told Jesus that he already followed all of them but was still lacking something. Jesus then told him in verse 21, "If you would be perfect, go, sell what you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." When the rich young ruler heard this, he went away sad.

What? Is Jesus asking us to sell all our stuff? Maybe. When Jesus told the young man to sell all his stuff, He was telling him to get rid of everything that he had that was more important to him than Jesus. He is asking us to do the same. Jesus wants us to let go of whatever takes our focus off Him, so we can follow Him.

Real JOY comes from following Jesus and allowing Him to work through us. Sometimes that means that we must OVERCOME the desire to focus on "stuff." At the end of the day, it's not about us, it's about Him.

The story in Matthew goes on to say that the rich young ruler was very sad when he walked away from the conversation with Jesus. He was sad, because he was not willing to give up the things that he loved to follow Jesus. What about you? Are you willing to say yes to whatever He is asking you to do?

APPLY

What do you have to Overcome to make Jesus first in your life? Pray that God gives you nudges when you start to take your eyes away from Him.

THE HERO OF MY STORY

Who is the hero of your faith story? For many of us, our faith story serves as a way of sharing some of the most important details in our lives that led to choosing to follow Jesus. If we are not careful, though, we can share too much about our own actions and not enough about Christ's. It is helpful to think of Jesus as the hero and main focus of our story, so that the Gospel is clearly presented when we share how it all happened. Romans chapter 5 verse 8 and Ephesians chapter 2 verse 8 tell us that salvation was started and finished by Christ, and our part in that is simply to receive or reject.

Romans chapter 5 verse 8 says, "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Ephesians chapter 2 verse 8 says, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast."

This doesn't mean that you are no longer in your story; it just means that Jesus is the focus! In order to show Jesus as the hero, describe in detail what God has done and limit describing your own actions to ways in which you responded to His work. This will help your listeners to understand that they too are invited by God to follow Him, and that they can respond to that invitation any time.

SCRIPTURE. TRUE. OUR. REAL. YOU.

The word **Gospel** means **Good News.** It was used to announce good news about a new king. The good news told about the king's message, actions, and victories. The Gospel of Jesus is found in the Bible. It is the Good News of who Jesus is and what He has done. The Gospel story also tells us who we are, why we are broken, and how Jesus is the King who gave His life to rescue us. We are invited to be a part of God's story by trusting and following Jesus.



SCRIPTURE tells us who Jesus is and what He has done. If you are making a choice to trust and follow someone, you need to know who that person is. The Bible tells us the true story about who Jesus is and what He has done. Mark chapter 1 verse 1 tells us exactly who Jesus is: "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Mark says clearly that Jesus is the Son of God. We can look to Jesus to know exactly what God is like. The entire story of the Bible is about how Jesus is coming to rescue people from sin, because He is the true King.

But wait, why do we need Jesus to rescue us from our sins? Let me explain.

The story began with God creating all things. He called everything that He made, good. He created humans to know Him and to represent Him on the earth (Genesis 1:27). God created you, knows you, and loves you more than you could ever imagine. He created you to love Him and other people. This is your true identity.

Sadly, everything did not remain the way that God created it. Everything became broken.



OUR lives are broken by sin. The first humans that God created chose to turn away from Him. They broke their relationship with God. We have all chosen to live our own way, too. We have failed to fulfill God's purpose for our lives to love Him and other people. This is called sin. The Bible says that we have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Our lives and the world that we know are broken by sin. Because of this, we often feel distant and disconnected from God. We need someone to rescue us and reconnect us to God.



REAL love is Jesus giving His life for ours. Jesus came with a message of Good News. He was sent by God to rescue us and restore our relationship with God (Luke 19:10). Jesus never sinned. He perfectly loved God and all people. Jesus showed us real love by giving His life for our sins. He died and was buried, but on the third day, God raised Him from the dead. He was seen alive by over 500 people (1 Corinthians 15:3-6). He is the true King who rescued us by His love. We can now be forgiven, rescued, and reconnected to God.



You are invited into God's story.

There are many stories about who Jesus is and what He has done in the Bible. John chapter 20 verses 30 and 31 say, "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." John says that the Gospel story was written, so that you would believe that Jesus is the Son of God, and you can have eternal life. You are invited into God's story. This new life can begin by trusting and following Jesus.

If you would like to begin a relationship with God, I would like to invite you to pray with me.

PRAY: "God, I believe this Gospel story of Jesus. I know that I am broken. I ask you to forgive me of my sins. I want you to be the King of my life. I choose to trust and follow Jesus today and forever. Amen." (Pass out **Student Response Cards** while the Host shares **Response Time** from **Part 3**.)





"Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer." Romans 12:12

EXPLAIN

How is your prayer life? It is a simple question, but it can be tough to answer. We may think we have to pray with fancy words, but prayer is simply talking to God. Throughout the day, God longs to hear our requests.

For example: "Thank you for this breakfast, Lord." - "God, help me to focus on my schoolwork." - "Lord, help me love this person right now." - "God, will you show me what to do?"

The best way to strengthen your relationship with God is through developing a prayer life. Just like with any relationship, you make a point to communicate daily to show that you love and care for them. With God, it is no different. Romans chapter 12 verse 12 says, "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer." We rejoice in the hope that God will take care of everything. Our patience shows others that we are different in how we handle trials, and we are constant in prayer, knowing that God hears our requests.

So how can you be constant in prayer? You CHOOSE to. That might seem so simple, but without choosing each day to spend time in conversation with God, we will find ourselves not praying at all. Next, you need to pick a time and place where you can be alone with God. Jesus gave us a glimpse of what that looks like in Mark chapter 1 verse 35, "And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, he departed and went out to a desolate place, and there he prayed." Jesus got up before everyone else to go spend time alone with God praying. What time works best for you? It could be in the morning before school, on the bus ride, or maybe in the evening before you go to bed. Whatever time you choose, let's start today by making an appointment to spend time praying to God.

APPLY

Take a few minutes and fill out the appointment card for your prayer time with God. (Give students a few minutes.) Now that you have set the time and place, below is a simple way to start off your time in prayer.

t is for Thank You - Take time to thank God for all He has done.

s is for Sorry - Ask God for forgiveness for things you have done wrong.

p is for Please - Ask God for what you need or for the needs of others.

EXPLAIN

Last week we talked about how to make prayer a priority. Today we will use our highlight verse to help us overcome our anxiety by praying.

One thing that is true about all religions is that people pray. They chant or sit silently and speak to themselves or even out loud, but they pray. So what makes Christianity different? Great question. Let's look at today's highlight verse again in Philippians chapter 4 verse 6, "do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God."

Paul gives us an outline of how to do this. First, don't be anxious, worried, or even stressed! That's hard, because stress is all around us. How do we do this? When Paul wrote these words, he was in prison for his faith, so he was no stranger to stress. He was able to pray, because he had faith that God was hearing him. God is bigger than all of our stress and worries.

Second, pray and ask in every situation with thanksgiving. Prayer is simply talking and listening to God. That means talking to Him and thanking Him in the good times and the bad. God never gets tired of hearing our requests, no matter the situation. Paul is also telling us to make our requests known to God. He cares about even the little things. Even though God already knows what we need, He wants to hear us asking Him through prayer.

APPLY

There is comfort in prayer. For some, the hardest part is trying to find the right words or feeling like we don't know how to pray. The Bible tells us in Romans chapter 8 verse 26, "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words." He hears you. What is keeping you from praying?

RESPOND

3. SHARE HOW JESUS ENTERED YOUR STORY

Now describe how you came to know Jesus. Be sure to describe that moment or that process, if you can, with adjectives that show how meaningful and impactful it was for you. Try to describe how Jesus touched your heart and how you responded, such as asking Him to be your Lord and Savior. This part challenges people's idea of what God is like.

4. STATE THE IMPACT OF JESUS ON YOUR LIFE

Now describe how Jesus impacted your problem and your life. Use the emotion opposite of your keyword and share how Jesus either reversed your problem or is continually giving you the power to overcome. This is the part that inspires your hearers to place their hope in Jesus.

We have failed to fulfill God's purpose for our lives to love Him and other people. This is called sin. The Bible says that we have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Our lives and the world that we know are broken by sin. Because of this brokenness, instead of talking to God in prayer, we often feel alone and isolated from God. We need someone to rescue us and reconnect us to God.



REAL love is Jesus giving His life for ours. Jesus came with a message of Good News. He was sent by God to rescue us and restore our relationship with God (Luke 19:10). Jesus never sinned. He perfectly loved God and all people. Jesus showed us real love by giving His life for our sins (1 John 3:16). He died and was buried, but on the third day God raised Him from the dead. He was seen alive by over 500 people (1 Corinthians 15:3-6). He is the true King who rescued us by His love. We can now talk to God any time.



Jesus prayed that you would have eternal life by knowing Him (John 17:3). You are invited into God's story. This new life can begin by trusting and following Jesus.







EXPLAIN

On a scale of 1 to 10, how important is going to church to you? (Wait for students to respond.) Society would try to convince you that as long as you say you believe in God, you don't need to go to church. Often times we may think we don't need to hang out with other Christians to grow in our faith. But we do need each other, so that we stay faithful to the Lord. Without the support of a local church/youth group, we can easily fall back into our old way of living.

Our need for community is our focus in today's scripture. In Hebrews chapter 10 verses 24 and 25, we are given a challenge; "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." When we stir up one another to love and good works, we are comforting those who are struggling, encouraging others to follow Jesus, and connecting to believers, so that they can grow in their faith. We are building COMMUNITY!

So why are people staying away from church? (Wait for students to respond.)
Ask yourself this question: "Do I really believe that I need encouragement to maintain my faith?" The answer should be YES! Believers share their struggles with each other and pray for one another. In First Thessalonians chapter 5 verse 11, Paul encourages believers, "Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing." Allow fellow believers to encourage you, and if you are not a part of a church, we would love to get you connected today.

APPLY

And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved." It was a group of people gathering daily to worship, pray, eat, and share one another's burdens. As these people continued to meet, their numbers grew, because they felt connected to people who cared and had things in common. They even sold their own things to meet the needs of others. This is exactly what the church is supposed to look like. Galatians chapter 6 verse 2 says for us to "bear one another's burdens."

Often people have a difficult time going to a church for several reasons. They don't want to feel judged, or maybe they have been hurt in the past. Others find it difficult to open up to others about life's struggles. This is exactly why it is important to get connected to a community of people that will encourage you, just as they did in the very first church. The church is where you can go to be encouraged and learn about how much God loves you and wants to use you to reach more people. The church is made up of people that welcome you in, point you to Jesus, and encourage your faith.

SCRIPTURE. TRUE. OUR. REAL. YOU.

The word **Gospel** means **Good News**. It was used to announce good news about a new king. The good news told about the king's message, actions, and victories. The Gospel of Jesus is found in the Bible. It is the Good News of who Jesus is and what He has done. The Gospel story also tells us who we are, why we are broken, and how Jesus is the King who gave His life to rescue us. We are invited to be a part of God's story by trusting and following Jesus.



SCRIPTURE tells us who Jesus is and what He has Have you ever wished that you could be a part of a story that is bigger than yourself? Jesus invited people into a story that changed everything. He invited people into community with God. All people can be a part of God's family by believing in Jesus. But why is it such a big deal that Jesus invited us into the Gospel story? It is because of who He is.

The Bible tells us the true story about who Jesus is and what He has done. Mark chapter 1 verse 1 tells us exactly who Jesus is: "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Mark says clearly that Jesus is the Son of God. We can look to Jesus to know exactly what God is like. The entire story of the Bible is about how Jesus is coming to rescue people from sin, because He is the true King.



TRUE identity begins with knowing that God created us.

The story began with God creating all things. He called everything that He made, good. He created humans to know Him and to represent Him on the earth (Genesis 1:27). God created you, knows you, and loves you more than you could ever imagine. He has created you to love Him and other people. This is your true identity. God also created you to have community with Him.

Sadly, everything did not remain the way that God created it. Everything became broken.



Our lives are broken by sin.

The first humans that God created chose to turn away from Him. They broke their relationship with God. We have all chosen to live our own way, too. We have failed to fulfill God's purpose for our lives to love Him and other people. This is called sin. The Bible says that we have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Our lives and the world that we know are broken by sin. Instead of feeling like we belong in community with God and others, we often feel isolated and alone. We need someone to rescue us and bring us back into community with God.







"Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger." James 1:19

EXPLAIN

We live in a world of talk. Talk, talk, talk. Speak, speak, speak. Everyone, it seems, wants to be heard. We have become a culture full of talking heads, regardless of where we find ourselves. And the chatter is deafening. Into this noise comes the words of James in chapter 1 verse 19, "Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger." This verse is almost impossible to understand by a culture intent on talking. We have it backwards: we are quick to speak, slow to hear.

Do you remember the story of Martha and Mary in Luke chapter 10 verses 38 through 42? Luke offers us a helpful contrast in speaking and listening. Martha was frantically trying to make dinner preparations for Jesus and the disciples. I envision her running around the house, uttering things under her breath like, "I can't believe Jesus is here on such short notice" and "Why doesn't Mary get in here and help me?" Unlike Martha in verse 39, it tells us what Mary was doing: "And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to His teaching."

Not surprisingly, Martha gets a bit frustrated at Mary's lack of effort with the event. So Martha does what we probably all would do under similar circumstances - she starts talking. In verses 40 through 42, it says, "But Martha was distracted with much serving. And she went up to him and said, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me." We are not left to wonder which course of action Jesus commands. We see it in His gentle rebuke: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her."

Mary was quick to listen and slow to speak. She knew when to be quiet. In a culture full of chatter, I want to learn how to be silent, so I can hear what the Lord wants to teach me. He's speaking. Am I listening?

APPLY

Today we are going to use our Help Tool as a reminder to stop talking and start listening to God and others. Also, we will use The Cause Circle to help us be more intentional about sharing Jesus' message.

- Pass out the W.A.I.T. stickers (Why Am I Talking) and place them on your binder or phone as a reminder to choose daily to listen.
- Then pass out The Cause Circle and explain: Prayer Care Share
 - **Prayer**: It all starts with prayer! Praying for the people we are seeking to reach with the Gospel prepares their hearts to hear the Good News of Jesus.
 - Care: Jesus modeled how important it is to care for people's needs. In the same way, we must love those we are trying to reach. We do this by listening to them and caring for them.
 - **Share**: After prayer and care, we must lovingly share the Gospel message clearly and confidently. When we invite someone to put their faith in Christ, we are inviting them to make the best decision of their lives.

"Listen to advice and accept instruction, that you may gain wisdom in the future." Proverbs 19:20

EXPLAIN

Last week we learned the story of Mary and Martha and about being still and listening. Mary would listen well, while Martha stayed busy and missed out on what Jesus had to say. We have the same problem. We want to be heard. We want people to hear about our day or our experiences. Why is it so difficult for us to listen? We struggle with this, because we would rather speak our thoughts instead of listening to the thoughts of others.

Proverbs chapter 19 verse 20 tells us to "listen to advice and accept instruction, that you may gain wisdom in the future." So listen to advice and take instruction. This verse describes the need for listening. It takes effort, patience, and being intentional. A lot of times we barely listen, because we are distracted by our surroundings. Instead of concentrating on what's being said, we are busy deciding what to say in response or mentally rejecting the other person's point of view.

Proverbs chapter 18 verse 2 says, "It is the fool who takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing his opinion." It means a lot to a person to be heard. When someone starts talking to you, they are inviting you to walk with them and go on a journey for a short time. Maybe it's not your first choice of conversation, or maybe you are in a hurry and feel like you don't have the time. Stop and take the time to invest in someone else's story. Be an example of God's love, and let His light shine through simply by listening.

The Bible says that Jesus was a friend of sinners. That's our example—to be a friend, to listen to people, see where they are, and then take them where they need to go.

APPLY

Be ready whenever someone needs to talk. It might mean you have to give up a lunch or maybe a workout. God is asking us to represent Him to others, and God always listens to us.

RESPOND

Let's get into groups and discuss these questions:

- Who is someone you listen to when you need advice?
- When you listen, are you listening to learn from them or waiting for a moment of silence so you can interject what you think?
- Share a time when NOT listening got you in trouble.

BIG IDEA TO REMEMBER

The best ministry you might do for someone today is to simply listen.

CARDBOARD TESTIMONY

We have seen homeless people standing on street corners with a piece of cardboard and a message, such as "Will Work for Food," "Need Money," or "Please help me feed my family." That is where the idea for cardboard testimonies began. The silent message can speak volumes in just a few words.

We have put our own spin on the idea by sharing a few words on one side of the cardboard about our life before Jesus and writing a few words on the back about our transformation after Jesus made us a new creation. Not many of us get an opportunity to stand before an audience and speak about what the Lord has done in our lives. Even fewer Christians want to speak before an audience because of fear. A cardboard testimony is a way to share the change Jesus has made in our lives without speaking a word. It is a powerful witness to the transforming power of God's Spirit in our lives.

- Paul is one of the most prominent Christians in the Bible. His testimony would probably say: side one: murderer - Christian hater side two: evangelist - prisoner for Jesus
- The disciple John would perhaps say: side one: selfish - angry side two: beloved by Christ
- Zacchaeus encountered Christ, who invited Him home to dinner. His testimony? side one: cheater - thief side two: generous - forgiven
- One of the most powerful testimonies would come from Lazarus: side one: literally dead for 4 days side two: alive - healthy - following Jesus

Now we're going to share our cardboard testimonies. (Pass out paper and pens to everyone.) On one side write what your life was like before Jesus, and keep it simple. Flip it over to the other side and write the difference Jesus has made in your life.

What does your cardboard testimony say?

(If time allows, without saying a word, show side one that shares your life before Jesus. Pause for a moment, so that people can read it. Then flip to side two that shows the difference Jesus has made in your life.)

SCRIPTURE, TRUE, OUR, REAL, YOU.

The word **Gospel** means **Good News.** It was used to announce good news about a new king. The good news told about the king's message, actions, and victories. The Gospel of Jesus is found in the Bible. It is the Good News of who Jesus is and what He has done. The Gospel story also tells us who we are, why we are broken, and how Jesus is the King who gave His life to rescue us. We are invited to be a part of God's story by trusting and following Jesus.



SCRIPTURE tells us who Jesus is and what He has done. There are many voices that we are told to listen to. Some are good, like teachers, coaches, and parents. Other are not so good. We have to choose who we will listen to. The Gospel story tells us to listen to Jesus because of who He is.

The Bible tells us the true story about who Jesus is and what He has done. Mark chapter 1 verse 1 tells us exactly who Jesus is: "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Mark says clearly that Jesus is the Son of God. We can look to Jesus to know exactly what God is like. The entire story of the Bible is about how Jesus is coming to rescue people from sin, because He is the true King.



TRUE identity begins with knowing that God created us.

But wait, why do we need Jesus to rescue us from our sins? Let me explain.

The story began with God creating all things. He called everything that He made, good. He created humans to know Him and to represent Him on the earth (Genesis 1:27). God created you, knows you, and loves you more than you could ever imagine. He has created you to love Him and other people. This is your true identity. God also created you to hear His voice and respond.

Sadly, everything did not remain the way that God created it. Everything became broken.



Our lives are broken by The first humans that God created chose to turn away from Him. They broke their relationship with God. We have all chosen to live our own way, too. We have failed to fulfill God's purpose for our lives to love Him and other people. This is called sin. The Bible says that we have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Our lives and the world that we know are broken by sin. Instead of listening to God, we listen to other voices that lead us away from Him. This causes us to feel distant and disconnected from God. We need someone to rescue us and reconnect us to God.



REAL love is Jesus giving His life for ours. Jesus came with a message of Good News. He was sent by God to rescue us and restore our relationship with God (Luke 19:10). Jesus never sinned. He perfectly loved God and all people. Jesus showed us real love by giving His life for our sins. He died and was buried, but on the third day, God raised Him from the dead. He was seen alive by over 500 people (1 Corinthians 15:3-6).

He is the true King who rescued us by His love. Listening to Him is the first step to being rescued.



You are invited into God's story.

You have a choice about who you will listen to. By listening to this Good News about Jesus and believing it, you can be rescued from sin. You are invited into God's story. It begins with a choice to trust and follow Jesus.

If you would like to begin a relationship with God, I would like to invite you to pray with me. **PRAY**: "God, I believe this Gospel story of Jesus. I know that I am broken. I ask you to forgive me of my sins. I want you to be the King of my life. I choose to trust and follow Jesus today and forever. Amen."




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

"Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." Ephesians 4:32

EXPLAIN

In a fallen world, forgiveness is essential to maintain close relationships. We all need forgiveness, and we all need to grant forgiveness. Why? Because we all sin, and we all have been sinned against. But asking for and granting forgiveness are not easy tasks! If you're a Christian, asking and granting forgiveness are not optional. Jesus said in Matthew chapter 6 verse 15, that if you do not forgive others, the heavenly Father will not forgive you: "but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." It is important for you as a Christian to understand and practice forgiveness.

The Apostle Paul tells us in Ephesians chapter 4 verse 31 how we are to put away all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and slander. In verse 32, it tells us how we are to replace these sins: "Be kind to one another, cenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." What does it mean to ask forgiveness or to forgive someone? Paul says that we are to forgive each other "just as God in Christ also has forgiven you." God didn't say, "Hey, don't worry about it. We all make mistakes!" He didn't just brush our sin aside. He requires that the penalty be paid. But in love, He sent His own Son to bear the penalty that we deserved.

How do we put forgiveness into practice? To forgive someone is to promise not to bring the matter up again or use it against them. God forgives us, so that we may be reconciled to Him and enjoy a close relationship with Him. When we forgive others, we should also seek to restore the broken relationship. This does not always mean becoming best of friends, but it should at least mean that we are friendly towards the person. To say, "I forgive you, but I never want to see your ugly face again," is not to forgive as God forgives! We are still commanded to love our enemies, do good to those who hate us, bless those who curse us, and pray for those who mistreat us. Luke chapter 6 verses 27 and 28: "But I say to you who hear, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you."

When you forgive, you will get rid of your bitterness, which eats at your soul. You will enjoy restored relationships with others, along with many other blessings. But the most important thing is that you will glorify God with your actions.

APPLY

Today's Help Tool is the Candy Cane Gospel. It is a great way to share how Jesus forgives. (Pass out a candy cane and a card to each person. Instructions below will help you explain.) The shape of the candy cane reminds us of a **Shepherd's Staff**. In John chapter 10 verse 14, it says, "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me."

- The **Red Stripe** on the candy cane represents the blood that Jesus shed to forgive us of our sins. Romans chapter 5 verse 8 says, "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." We need forgiveness, because in Romans chapter 3 verse 23, we are reminded that we ALL have sinned: "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."
- The White Candy represents the forgiveness of sins and a clean heart. First John chapter 1 verse 19 says, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."
- When the candy cane is turned upside down, it represents a "J" for Jesus! To begin a relationship with Him, we must do what Romans chapter 10 verse 9 says, "if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

RESPOND

Let's get into groups and practice sharing the Candy Cane Gospel, before we leave today. It is a great example of forgiveness.

EXPLAIN

When we think about forgiveness, it brings certain pictures to our mind. Maybe it's something that makes you think of a time when you were forgiven, because you had done something wrong. Did you feel a sense of relief when it was over? Maybe you have forgiven someone that has wronged you. Maybe you were in the right, but you still wanted to forgive them. How did you feel about that? Forgiveness is a choice we make.

In Colossians chapter 3 verse 13 it says, "bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive." We are to forgive. We are to work through difficulties in relationships and to forgive one another, even as Christ has forgiven us. We are NOT perfect!

TRUTH ALERT: You WILL mess up and make mistakes.

You will want forgiveness for something you have done or mistakes you have made. We understand forgiveness when we receive it and when we are actually and truthfully sorrowful for our actions. We hope to be restored to a clean slate. We can only forgive others, when we realize how much Jesus has forgiven us by his death.

Forgiveness is an exciting thing to receive. Think of how you felt when you realized your sin was forgiven and Jesus was now Savior and Lord of your life. We want our friends to experience this, too, as we share the Gospel in love and not in fear.

APPLY

Think of a time in your life where you dreaded to ask for forgiveness. Maybe it's not the first time you messed up or failed in something. Just the thought of asking for forgiveness makes you sick at your stomach. Think of it this way. If you had someone to go before you to soften the blow or ease the pain of seeking forgiveness, wouldn't that make things easier? This is what Jesus has done for us and we can help others find Jesus, too.

SCRIPTURE. TRUE. OUR. REAL. YOU.

The word **Gospel** means **Good News.** It was used to announce good news about a new king. The good news told about the king's message, actions, and victories. The Gospel of Jesus is found in the Bible. It is the Good News of who Jesus is and what He has done. The Gospel story also tells us who we are, why we are broken, and how Jesus is the King who gave His life to rescue us. We are invited to be a part of God's story by trusting and following Jesus.



SCRIPTURE tells us who Jesus is and what He has done. Have you ever done something that you wish you could undo? Have you ever wondered if God would forgive you for things you have done wrong? Is there someone who can rescue you from the guilt of past mistakes? The Gospel story tells us that God wants to forgive us. Jesus has the power to forgive us for anything we have done wrong because of who He is.

The Bible tells us the true story about who Jesus is and what He has done. Mark chapter 1 verse 1 tells us exactly who Jesus is: "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Mark says clearly that Jesus is the Son of God. We can look to Jesus to know exactly what God is like. The entire story of the Bible is about how Jesus is coming to rescue people from sin, because He is the true King.



TRUE identity begins with knowing that God created

us.

But wait, why do we need Jesus to rescue us from our sins? Let me explain.

The story began with God creating all things. He called everything that He made, good. He created humans to know Him and to represent Him on the earth (Genesis 1:27). God created you, knows you, and loves you more than you could ever imagine. He has created you to love Him and other people. This is your true identity.

Sadly, everything did not remain the way that God created it. Everything became broken.



Our lives are broken by The first humans that God created chose to turn away from Him. They broke their relationship with God. We have all chosen to live our own way, too. We have failed to fulfill God's purpose for our lives to love Him and other people. This is called sin. The Bible says that we have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Our lives and the world that we know are broken by sin. Because of this, we feel guilt and disconnected from God. We need someone to forgive us.



REAL love is Jesus giving His life for ours.

Jesus came with a message of Good News. He was sent by God to rescue us and restore our relationship with God (Luke 19:10). Jesus never sinned. He perfectly loved God and all people. Jesus showed us real love by giving His life for our sins. He died and was buried, but on the third day, God raised Him from the dead. He was seen alive by over 500 people (1 Corinthians 15:3-6). He is the true King who rescued us by His love.



You are invited into God's story.

Jesus often said that He had power to forgive sins (Mark 2:10). His death and resurrection proved that He can forgive anyone who asks Him. He will forgive you! You are invited into God's story. It begins with a choice to trust and follow Jesus.

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



HIGHLIGHT SCRIPTURE

"Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience." **Colossians 3:12**

EXPLAIN

When you think about kindness, what comes to mind? (Allow students to respond.) We often think about kindness as a single act, such as "random acts of kindness" and not a part of who you are. However, the Bible tells us that we are to clothe ourselves in kindness, which goes far beyond just doing kind things for others "randomly."

What if we stopped thinking of kindness as an action and started thinking of kindness as a part of who we are? In Colossians chapter 3 verse 12, it says, "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."

This verse says that we are supposed to clothe ourselves with kindness. When you get dressed in the morning, do you just wear your clothes long enough for someone to see them before taking them off? Of course not! That would defeat the entire purpose of wearing clothes. In the same way, kindness should not be a single action completed and then forgotten. Instead, it should be something we put on, wrapped all around us, and worn all day long.

Here are a couple of ways that will help you be clothed with kindness every day. One is to pray for opportunities to be kind. Find things to compliment people on. Take a little extra time to think before you speak and ask yourself, "Am I building others up or tearing them down?" In the words of Thumper, "If you can't something nice, don't say nothing at all."

It's so important to show kindness to everyone, even the people who you don't feel like being kind to. No matter what people look like on the outside, you never know what they are going through on the inside. It will never hurt to be kind, but it will always hurt to be unkind. In a world where you can be anything, be kind!

EXPLAIN

Have you ever spent time with someone who is always complaining and finding fault in everything or someone who is always negative about everything? Even when things are going well, they just can't seem to find a kind word. Sometimes it's difficult to be around people like that. Now think about someone who is always kind and has kind words to say in any situation. Which person would you rather be around? Which person are you?

In Ephesians chapter 4 verse 32, Paul gave us the command: "Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." We should do this, because God was kind and tender-hearted to us. He was so kind that He gave His only Son, so that we could have eternity in heaven.

What do we need to overcome in our own lives to not just be kind but to live a life of kindness? We need to think about the words we use, before we use them. Are they kind and encouraging? If not, don't say them. Are we building someone up or tearing them down, even if the words might be true? Kindness is also not complaining or gossiping. OUCH!! Kindness is letting someone go before us in line at the store or at the 4-way stop sign and maybe even putting the shopping cart in the cart corral. Kindness is thinking of others before ourselves. We know this is hard in this me-me-me culture.

The secret to kindness is to just be a kind person and not just sometimes. Let kindness be a lifestyle. When we have a relationship with Jesus, we have kindness in us. When we live a life of kindness, is it just as much of a blessing to us as it is to the person we are being kind to. There is great joy in seeing others' lives change because someone was kind to them.

The kindest thing you can do is to pray for someone. Take the negative thoughts and comments and turn them into a prayer for that person. Jesus was kind and He prayed for others. Be like Jesus!

APPLY

All cultures seem to have something to say about kindness. There is even a saying, "No act of kindness, no matter how small, is ever wasted." So as followers of Jesus, we are to be kind to others, no matter how large or small, so that others can see Jesus.

HIGHLIGHT SCRIPTURE

"In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the payment for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another." 1 John 4:10-11

EXPLAIN

You've probably heard at church or at home that you should love others. But you may have wondered, what does that look like? What does it really mean to love others?

Love looks different from what you see on TV. It looks different than what you hear in the hallways at school. True love, the way God meant it, looks way different than the way we see it portrayed. Many times, the definition of love on TV or school goes something like this: "I'll love you, if you can do something for me, or if you can give me something." However, this isn't the meaning of "loving others" that the Bible describes.

First John chapter 4 verses 10 and 11 say, "In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent his Son to be the payment for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another." These verses show us that God defines love differently than what we see at school and on TV. God didn't wait for us to be able to give Him something for Him to love us. God loved us first and gave His Son, before we even knew Him. Wow, that's LOVE! Then God challenges us to take the love He gave to us and show it to others.

Loving others isn't based on how others treat us. It is based on God's love and grace, which empowers us to then love others. We are to love others and value them, not because they have done anything to deserve it, but because it is the example God showed us first. But don't take my word for it. First John chapter 4 verse 19 says, "We love because He first loved us."

So today choose to love others. Treat them with respect that's not based on what they can do for you or how they treat you, but rather is based on how God treats you!

"And behold, a lawyer stood up to put him to the test, saying, 'Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the Law? How do you read it?' And he answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." Luke 10:25-27

EXPLAIN

In these verses, Jesus was teaching the people, when a lawyer stands up and asks Jesus a question, "What do I need to do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus questions him back, "What does the law say?" The man answers by quoting scripture, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." Jesus then says, "Do this and you will live!" Wow, that's all there is? Well, not really. There's more. We must love God with more than just words and actions.

Let's break this down:

"All your heart" means to love God with all your desires, without hiding anything. "All your soul" means to love God with your innermost being, the real you. "All your strength" means loving God with everything you have. "With all your mind" means to love God with everything you think about. When we love God like that, we will love our neighbors, too. Who are our neighbors? Everyone. We love others because God loves us.

When we begin a relationship with Jesus, we give Him our heart, soul, strength and mind. It is then that we can love others the way He loves us. The greatest need people around us have is to have the love of Jesus through salvation. What do you need to overcome to choose to love your neighbor as yourself?

APPLY

If others are ever going to see the love of Jesus, they may have to see it through a person in their school who is different in how they act and react. The love of Jesus breaks down barriers, and we get to share, and to show that love to our friends and classmates.

RESPOND

Let's get into groups and discuss these questions:

- How can you show the love of Jesus to a friend or classmate?
- What struggles do you have with loving other people?
- Share how you have been shown love.

SCRIPTURE. TRUE. OUR. REAL. YOU.

The word **Gospel** means **Good News.** It was used to announce good news about a new king. The good news told about the king's message, actions, and victories. The Gospel of Jesus is found in the Bible. It is the Good News of who Jesus is and what He has done. The Gospel story also tells us who we are, why we are broken, and how Jesus is the King who gave His life to rescue us. We are invited to be a part of God's story by trusting and following Jesus.



SCRIPTURE tells us who Jesus is and what He has done. The greatest love stories are about someone making a sacrifice for the person they love. Did you know that someone loved you so much that they gave their life for you? Jesus did. He is the perfect example of love. John chapter 15 verse 13 says, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." After saying this, He gave His life for all people. This was the greatest act of love in human history because of who Jesus is.

The Bible tells us the true story about who Jesus is and what He has done. Mark chapter 1 verse 1 tells us exactly who Jesus is: "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Mark says clearly that Jesus is the Son of God. We can look to Jesus to know exactly what God is like. The entire story of the Bible is about how Jesus is coming to rescue people from sin, because He is the true King.



But wait, why do we need Jesus to rescue us from our sins? Let me explain.

The story began with God creating all things. He called everything that He made, good. He created humans to know Him and to represent Him on the earth (Genesis 1:27). God created you, knows you, and loves you more than you could ever imagine. He has created you to love Him and other people. This is your true identity.

Sadly, everything did not remain the way that God created it. Everything became broken.



Our lives are broken by sin.

The first humans that God created chose to turn away from Him. They broke their relationship with God. We have all chosen to live our own way, too. We have failed to fulfill God's purpose for our lives to love Him and other people. This is called sin. The Bible says that we have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Our lives and the world that we know are broken by sin. We often don't realize how much God loves us. Instead, we feel unloved and disconnected from God. We need God's love to rescue us.



REAL love is Jesus giving His life for ours Jesus came with a message of Good News. He was sent by God to rescue us and restore our relationship with God (Luke 19:10). Jesus never sinned. He perfectly loved God and all people. Jesus showed us real love by giving His life for our sins. He died and was buried, but on the third day, God raised Him from the dead. He was seen alive by over 500 people (1 Corinthians 15:3-6). He is the true king who rescued us by His love.



You are invited into God's story.

Jesus often said that He had power to forgive sins (Mark 2:10). His death and resurrection proved that He can forgive anyone who asks Him. He will forgive you! You are invited into God's story. It begins with a choice to believe in Jesus.

If you would like to begin a relationship with God, I would like to invite you to pray with me. **PRAY**: "God, I believe this Gospel story of Jesus. I know that I am broken. I ask you to forgive me of my sins. I want you to be the King of my life. I choose to trust and follow Jesus today and forever. Amen."

3 FOLLOW-UP STEPS



HIGHLIGHT SCRIPTURE

"Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." **Hebrews 13:15-16**

EXPLAIN

Sacrifice. There's no way to sugar-coat it. It hurts. It's supposed to. Sacrifice isn't pleasant. It is the act of giving up something you love or value for a greater purpose.

Paul says in Philippians chapter 2 verses 6 through 8 that Jesus, "emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." It's important to understand what Jesus emptied Himself of. He left the comforts of heaven to come to earth, to take on human form, to die on a cross. He gave up all this, so that He could meet our need for salvation.

We will never be called to make that kind of sacrifice, but let's look at some sacrifices we can make in response to Jesus' sacrifice. In Hebrews chapter 13 verses 15 and 16, God tells us what sacrifices please Him, "Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." When we bring a "sacrifice of praise," we choose to believe that, even though life is not going as we think it should, God is still good and can be trusted. When we choose to praise God, despite the storms, He is honored, and our faith grows deeper. Real praise continues, regardless of circumstances.

In verse 16, it tells the other sacrifices that please God: doing good and sharing with others. Instead of focusing on ourselves and our own needs, look for opportunities to pour into other people. Stop living for yourself. The world is full of people who are hurt, lost, and discouraged. You don't have to save the world, Jesus already did that. But helping others is something He wants us to do. Don't wait. Take the opportunity to help someone. You won't regret it, and God won't forget it - "For such sacrifices are pleasing to God."

This week's Help Tool will help you share Jesus' sacrifice on the cross and how you can choose a relationship with Him. Pass out an eFold to each student and explain what each section means, by following the instructions in the packet.

How to lead someone to Jesus Christ using the eFolds (English)

1) SHOW 'MAN IN SIN' SEPARATED FROM 'GOD'



- God is perfect and without sin.
- God loves us!

- The Bible also says that "God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son Jesus, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)
- The Bible says, "God demonstrates His own love for us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)

3) OPEN TO THE 'TOMB'

6) OPEN TO 'HEAVEN & HELL'

- The Bible says that whoever believes in Jesus has eternal life and is not judged. But whoever does not believe in Jesus has been judged already and the wrath of God remains upon him! (John 3:16, 18, 36).

ASK THE QUESTION: Would you like to trust Jesus right now and be saved? (if YES, continue)

(if yes) The Bible says, "If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you shall be saved. * (Romans 10:9) I can lead us in a prayer to God. Remember, it's not saying the words that saves you; God is looking at your heart for true faith in Jesus. Ready? (If yes) Let's pray:

"God, thank You for loving me. / I confess that I have sinned against You. / I believe that Your Son Jesus / died on a cross / to pay for my sins, and that You raised Jesus from the dead. / I now put my faith only in Jesus / to forgive me / and save me from my sins. / I confess that Jesus is Lordf / Thank you for your gift of eternal life. / I pray in Jesus 'name, / Amen."



ASSURANCE OF SALVATION: SHOW 'HEAVEN & HELL'

If you took that step of trusting in Jesus Christ today, here's what the Bible says about you: "As many as received Jesus, to all who believed in His name, to them He gave the right to become children of God. (John 1:12) (Point at the hands) lesus also says, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow Me; and I give eternal life to them, and they shall never perish; and no one shall snatch them out of My hand."

STEPS FOR FOLLOWERS OF CHRIST!



LOVE GOD AND ALL PEOPLE.

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and foremost commandment And a second is like it: you shall love your neighbor as yourself."



STUDY THE BIBLE (GOD'S WORD) DAILY.

Start with the gospel of John; read 1 chapter each day. "Like newborn babes, long for the pure milk of the word, that by it you may grow in respect to salvation..." (1 Peter 2:2)

PRAY TO GOD CONSTANTLY.

In prayer you can thank and worship God, ask for His help, confess your sins, and pray for others. "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God." (Phil. 4:6-7)



MEET REGULARLY WITH OTHER CHRISTIANS.

"Then he said to them all: Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will save it." **Luke 9:23-24**

EXPLAIN

Sacrifice: an act of giving up something you value for the sake of something else that is important or worthy.

Living a life for ourselves adds stress, pressure, and chaos to our life. We miss out on the peace that only comes from sacrificial living. When we sacrifice, we give up something that means a lot to us. For instance, if we give away clothes that we never wear or games that we never play, is that sacrifice? Nope. If what we give up doesn't mean anything to us, it doesn't mean anything to God. In Luke chapter 9 verses 23 and 24, Jesus gave instructions when He said, "whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."

What does it mean to deny myself and take up my cross daily? It means that we sacrifice our thoughts, our needs, and even our time for service to God. What would motivate us to do this? We do this because we love God and are called to serve Him. We don't serve others just to get credit or recognition or so that our good deeds outweigh our bad deeds. To deny ourselves means to give up anything that keeps us from doing what God intends for us. We don't usually like to give up anything.

How about taking up our cross? What's that? You see, Jesus doesn't simply call us to believe that He existed or even to believe that He can save us. He calls on us to commit our whole lives to Him—to trust Him alone for our salvation and then to follow Him as His disciples. Luke chapter 14 verse 27 says, "Anyone who does not carry his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple."

Have you allowed Jesus to be in complete control of your life? Have you put to death your own plans and committed yourself to His plans for your life? Don't be satisfied with anything less, for there is no greater joy in life than following Christ every day.

APPLY

So what does this mean for us? It means no matter what we think or do, we are to sacrifice our wants and desires and to follow Christ; we are to sacrifice our comfort and share the Gospel with others. This becomes a lifestyle and a way of giving up what we want, so that we can share the Gospel.

RESPOND

Let's get into groups and discuss:

- What are things, times, events, you can sacrifice for the sake of others?
- How have others sacrificed for you? For example: parents, grandparents, family, and friends.
- Think of three things that you can do this week that would be considered a sacrifice for someone else.

BOTH SIDES OF THE STORY

Have you ever heard two people tell the same story? Most of the time there are two sides to every story. Our faith story is a lot like that, too. One side of the story is about us and what our life was like before and after beginning a relationship with Jesus. That part is very important. But sometimes we forget the other side of the story, which is how much Jesus sacrificed to rescue us from our sin and brokenness.

SCRIPTURE. TRUE. OUR. REAL. YOU.

The word **Gospel** means **Good News.** It was used to announce good news about a new king. The good news told about the king's message, actions, and victories. The Gospel of Jesus is found in the Bible. It is the Good News of who Jesus is and what He has done. The Gospel story also tells us who we are, why we are broken, and how Jesus is the King who gave His life to rescue us. We are invited to be a part of God's story by trusting and following Jesus.



SCRIPTURE tells us who Jesus is and what He has done. Has anyone ever given up something important for you? Maybe it was their time or a very expensive gift. There is a person who made the greatest sacrifice of all for you. Jesus gave His life to rescue the world from sin (Matthew 20:28). This is a big deal because of who Jesus is.

The Bible tells us the true story about who Jesus is and what He has done. Mark chapter 1 verse 1 tells us exactly who Jesus is: "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Mark says clearly that Jesus is the Son of God. We can look to Jesus to know exactly what God is like. The entire story of the Bible is about how Jesus is coming to rescue people from sin, because He is the true King.

But wait, why do we need Jesus to rescue us from our sins? Let me explain.

The story began with God creating all things. He called everything that He made, good. He created humans to know Him and to represent Him on the earth (Genesis 1:27). God created you, knows you, and loves you more than you could ever imagine. He has created you to love Him and other people. This is your true identity.

Sadly, everything did not remain the way that God created it. Everything became broken.



Our lives are broken by The first humans that God created chose to turn away from Him. They broke their relationship with God. We have all chosen to live our own way, too. We have failed to fulfill God's purpose for our lives to love Him and other people. This is called sin. The Bible says that we have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Our lives and the world that we know are broken by sin. We needed someone to love us so much that they would do anything to rescue us.



REAL love is Jesus giving His life for Jesus came with a message of Good News. He was sent by God to rescue us and restore our relationship with God (Luke 19:10). Jesus never sinned. He perfectly loved God and all people. Jesus showed us real love by giving His life for our sins. He died and was buried, but on the third day, God raised Him from the dead. He was seen alive by over 500 people (1 Corinthians 15:3-6). He is the true King who rescued us by His love.

Jesus giving His life for us was the greatest sacrifice in human history.



You are invited into God's story.

John chapter 3 verse 16 says, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." There is a reason for Jesus' sacrifice. He gave His life, so you can have eternal life. You are invited into God's story. It begins with a choice to believe in Jesus.

If you would like to begin a relationship with God, I would like to invite you to pray with me. **PRAY**: "God, I believe this Gospel story of Jesus. I know that I am broken. I ask you to forgive me of my sins. I want you to be the King of my life. I choose to trust and follow Jesus today and forever. Amen."

But the opposite is also true. If your talk doesn't match your walk, people with not want to hear what you have to say, and opportunities to share Jesus can be missed.

God will give us all opportunities to share about His goodness. Let us seize every opportunity to share Jesus and our hope of eternity.

EXPLAIN

Have you ever said, "I wish I would have thought of that?" That means you recognized an opportunity after you saw someone else do it first. We need to become more sensitive to the opportunities and the open doors that God presents in our lives. Every day God gives you opportunities to do good for people around you. Do you notice the people who need a word of encouragement, pat on the back, an errand done for them, or some other means of help?

The Bible says in Proverbs chapter 3 verse 27, "Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it." You won't always have an opportunity to help. So when you do, take the Nike approach: Just do it! You probably have people in your life that you've thought about helping. You have the best intentions, but so far, you've done nothing. Why didn't you act immediately?

We make excuses. One of the biggest ones is: "I'll do it when I have some free time." Guess what? You probably never will. If you're going to do any good in your life, the time is now. Proverbs chapter 27 verse 1 reminds us that, "Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring." Do good now, because you do not know what tomorrow will bring.

In John chapter 9 verse 4, Jesus says, "We must work the works of Him who sent me while it is day; night is coming, when no one can work." God has assigned tasks for all of us to do in our lives. Don't wait for perfect conditions; look for the opportunities God gives you to help and encourage others.

APPLY

When we miss opportunities to do good for others, we are also missing the opportunity to share Jesus. So what do we need to overcome in our own lives to see opportunities throughout our day? Maybe it's that we think we are too busy, maybe too shy, or even too afraid of what people will think. God is bigger than all that. Trust Him today and choose opportunities.

GOSPEL S.T.O.R.Y.

SCRIPTURE. TRUE. OUR. REAL. YOU.

The word **Gospel** means **Good News.** It was used to announce good news about a new king. The good news told about the king's message, actions, and victories. The Gospel of Jesus is found in the Bible. It is the Good News of who Jesus is and what He has done. The Gospel story also tells us who we are, why we are broken, and how Jesus is the King who gave His life to rescue us. We are invited to be a part of God's story by trusting and following Jesus.



SCRIPTURE tells us who Jesus is and what He has done. Who is a person you admire? Have they ever given you the opportunity to follow them and join them in changing the world? Jesus gave people the opportunity to follow Him and join His mission to change the world. Mark chapter 1 verse 17 says, "And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." Jesus invited everyone to follow Him and gave them a purpose. Why is it a big deal for Jesus to invite people to follow Him? It is because of who He is.

The Bible tells us the true story about who Jesus is and what He has done. Mark chapter 1 verse 1 tells us exactly who Jesus is: "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Mark says clearly that Jesus is the Son of God. We can look to Jesus to know exactly what God is like. The entire story of the Bible is about how Jesus is coming to rescue people from sin, because He is the true King.



But wait, why do we need Jesus to rescue us from our sins? Let me explain.

The story began with God creating all things. He called everything that He made, good. He created humans to know Him and to represent Him on the earth (Genesis 1:27). God created you, knows you, and loves you more than you could ever imagine. He has created you to love Him and other people. This is your true identity.

Sadly, everything did not remain the way that God created it. Everything became broken.



Our lives are broken by sin. The first humans that God created chose to turn away from Him. They broke their relationship with God. We have all chosen to live our own way, too. We have failed to fulfill God's purpose for our lives to love Him and other people. This is called sin. The Bible says that we have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23). Our lives and the world that we know are broken by sin. Because of this, we often feel hopeless and like there is no opportunity for things to be right again. We need someone to give us hope and make us right with God again.



REAL love is Jesus giving His life for ours. Jesus came with a message of Good News. He was sent by God to rescue us and restore our relationship with God (Luke 19:10). Jesus never sinned. He perfectly loved God and all people. Jesus showed us real love by giving His life for our sins. He died and was buried, but on the third day, God raised Him from the dead. He was seen alive by over 500 people (1 Corinthians 15:3-6). He is the true King who rescued us by His love.



You are invited to follow Jesus and find the purpose that God has for your life. There is hope for you to be right with God again. You are invited into God's story. This new life can begin by trusting and following Jesus.

If you would like to begin a relationship with God, I would like to invite you to pray with me. **PRAY**: "God, I believe this Gospel story of Jesus. I know that I am broken. I ask you to forgive me of my sins. I want you to be the King of my life. I choose to trust and follow Jesus today and forever. Amen."

3 FOLLOW-UP STEPS

1. Organize



Constitution and By-Laws

Article I - Name of the Club	
The First Priority Club of	School.

Article II - Purpose of the Club

- 1. To encourage friends to understand the importance of living in relationship with God, serve as a resource to help students enhance their spiritual lives, and provide an opportunity to integrate beliefs into daily living.
- 2. To provide members the occasion to grow in their faith and for them to develop into dynamic leaders on the campus and in the community.
- 3. To increase the self-esteem and moral foundation of peers, while discouraging premarital sex, substance abuse, bullying, violence, suicide, and more, so that each member will develop a greater respect for the authority placed over them and pursue a lifestyle consistent to that outlined in the Bible.

Article III - Qualifications of the Members

Club membership is open to any student in this school who agrees with and is able to comply with the stated guidelines in this Constitution/By-Laws, provided there is no attempt by them to disrupt the meeting. Membership is equated to consistent attendance and participation in the club.

Article IV - Student Leadership

Our club may or may not have individuals holding positions of office, depending on our school's requirements. Our team of officers/student leaders carries out the following duties, including, but not limited to: being greeters; promoting First Priority Club; being a club leader for a specific week; speaking publicly; teaching, as able; securing guest speakers; leading or co-leading small groups and skits; making announcements; and serving refreshments. Any candidate for leadership must be a devoted follower of Christ, avoiding disqualifying behavior that Scripture forbids (Galatians 5:19-21, 1 Corinthians 6:9-10), and setting a positive biblical example: "in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity." 1 Timothy 4:12, c.f. Galatians 5:22-25

Article V - Meetings

- 1. Our meetings are student led, in accordance with the Equal Access Act (20 U.S.C. 4071-74), passed by Congress in 1984.
- 2. Our meetings occur weekly and are coordinated with our faculty sponsor.
- 3. Our meetings provide students the opportunity to discover and develop leadership skills they will use the rest of their lives.
- 4. Our HOPE strategy of meetings provides students with the opportunity to grow, apply their personal faith, and enhance their relationships with friends and family.
- 5. Our meetings encourage students to invite their peers to be a part of an exciting club that assembles in a respectful and friendly atmosphere.

Article VI - Affiliation

- 1. Our club is affiliated with First Priority, a not-for-profit ministry that resources clubs to succeed in their stated purpose.
- First Priority connects a community volunteer to attend club meetings as an invited guest to help student leaders fulfill their assigned tasks.
